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A SPeCTaCuLaR, uNKNoWN TeRRiToRy

I Abadengo, in the northwest of the province and beside nearby Portugal, is an area crossed by the rivers Agueda, Huebra, Yeltes and Camaces, children of the river Duero, which have given shape to the authentic landscape and ethnography of these distant lands.

Its main attraction is Las Arribes del Duero Natural Park, A name, Arribes, that evokes in the collective mind suggestive natural images with dramatic waterfalls and stone outcrops that fall into the void in an unparalleled vision. A unique paradise for birds, a place where one can experience feeling happy, small and yet part of an infinite, mysterious whole, all at the same time.




To discover the south of this natural space, the visitor can go to the Casa del Parque in Sobradillo, an interpretation space where the opportunities, values and resources of this area are explained.

Travellers who are into gorges and straits can do the Ruta de los Miradores, the viewpoint route, in their cars. For those who prefer to walk, there is the Senderos de Frontera route (Border paths route), which connect unique villages, places and ways of life, while the ATB routes and centres are an invitation to do these roads on two wheels.



At La Fregeneda is the Vega del Terrón international dock, which communicates Salamanca with Oporto and the Atlantic ocean via the navigable river Duero, crossing among vineyards the Douro Internacional, the Portuguese twin of our park.



from San Felices to the south, the visitor can relive the history of this border by following the Ruta de las Fortificaciones (Border Fortresses Route), which becomes clear in the stately Ciudad Rodrigo and the Fuerte de la Concepción. Not far from there, in Portugal, the walled city of Almeida and the Aldeias Históricas (historical hamlets) can be added to enrich the route.

A visit to the Siega Verde site and its prehistoric rock engravings, declared World Heritage Site along with those of Coa in Portugal, is almost mandatory. They are located near the river Agueda.

And, for the curious traveller, there is a mythical world that is part of the local DNA, the Vettone Lands. To learn more about this, the places to go are the Casa del Conde Visitor Centre in Lumbrales and the castros and museums of Yecla and Las Merchanas.





n the San Felices route, the visitor can perceive history, time and its passing. The castle is a privileged viewpoint to explain and capture its significance.

While climbing the tower, it is possible to feel the character, at once warlike and austere, given by its builders, under the orders of the Portuguese king

At the top, a splendid terrace offers the possibility to identify and understand from above the ruins of the walls, fences and doors.

On the way down to the castle, the visitor might find it is the right time to reflect on what led the peasant called Ángel de Dios, almost a century ago, to rescue this tower from oblivion. Him, and his descendants, saved it and, in the year 2013, it was given to the council for the enjoyment of watching the passing of time from its watchtower.

istory and border are, unsurprisingly, the basic ingredients for the main festivals. For the Noveno festival, the Plaza Mayor square becomes an original, 19th century bullring made of carts joined together. And the Santa Cruz romería gathers a number of foreigners, mostly coming from the "Raya", that region that is Portuguese and Spanish at once.



The delicacies in San Felices are closely related to the landscape. On the one hand, there's those based on the good life "elixirs" and the landlocked microclimate in the Arribes: almonds, wine and olive oil. And on the other hand, those that come from the cereal fields: the bread, still made with traditional flavour, and the "pastries" from the convents, which hide a divine culinary wisdom.

De LoS GalleGoS

Much about San Felices de los Gallegos is contained in its name which, despite the fact that its founder was the Portuguese bishop Don Félix, seems to be nowadays more closely related to felicity. A state of mind that does not come from the absence of war and conflict, of which this village has had its share, but from the deep commitment of its people with dignity and hos-

A dignity made tangible in the Arco de las Campanas, where the people, back in the 15th century, executed the magistrate Fabián de Sesé to get rid of his tyrannical, bad government. And again, when the people achieved victory after over 300 years of litigation against the Noveno (Ninth), that scandalous tax that allowed the Dukes of Alba



of the fruits of their labour. A dignity that became a symbol, thanks to the determination of Mr. Angel de Dios, who saved the castle's keep, which was about to be sold and taken to the USA.

Their hospitable character, due to their frequent change of nationality (from Portuguese to Spanish, and back again), led to the establishment of family



ties and solidarity on both sides of the border. However, having been the object of desire of two countries throughout history, made of San Felices a "flower of the border", a most desired fruit that 923 521 757 grows in impossible places. 923 521 757



And this is the result, this village and the lands around it, a fruitful union between historic heritage and a prodigious nature. In this place the traveller will find an urban plan adapted to a defensive enclosure, landscapes cut open by great canyon walls and watched over by birds, colours, air and scents.


A walk around this village is a walk towards felicity. Because the name of San Felices says a lot about

And then, all of a sudden on the way to Portugal. this peaceful green and gold sea falls into the river Águeda and its Arribes. A great rift hides gentle, cautious waterways, which become thunderous when the floods make them indomitable. This is, then, a wild area where some nearly unique species find sanctuary, while around it grow olive trees, almond trees, orange trees...

These are places to be discovered by following some of their paths, such as the "oil path", the "puente de los Franceses" bridge or the "Mesa del Conde"...some spots from where the exceptional beauty of the cliffs can be admired.
